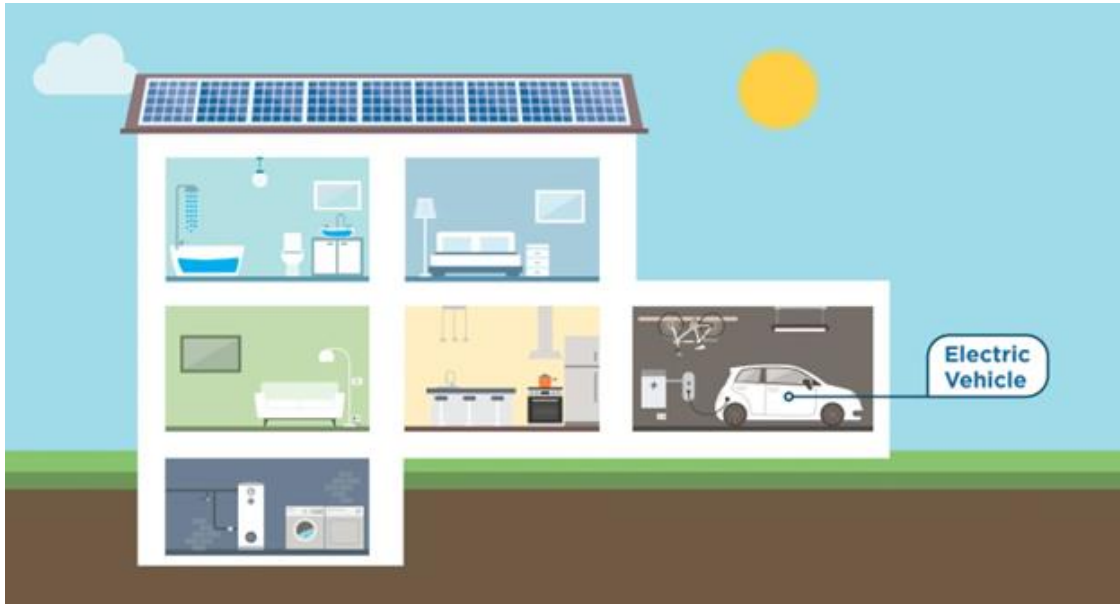

[IRS Federal New EV Credits](#) Federal rebates for New clean vehicles purchased in 2023 or after. All new electric, plug-in hybrid, and fuel cell electric vehicles purchased in 2023 or after may be eligible for a federal income tax credit of up to \$7,500. *Website*

[IRS Federal Used EV Credits](#) Federal rebates for Used clean vehicles. Beginning January 1, 2023, if you buy a qualified used electric vehicle (EV) or fuel cell vehicle (FCV) from a licensed dealer for \$25,000 or less, you may be eligible for a used clean vehicle tax credit. The credit equals 30% of the sale price up to a maximum credit of \$4,000. *Website*
